Schweiker Administration Honors 100 PA Companies As 'Best Places to Work in PA'

HARRISBURG, Pa., Nov. 29 /PRNewswire/ -- On behalf of Pennsylvania Gov. Mark Schweiker, Labor and Industry Secretary Johnny J. Butler tonight honored 100 Pennsylvania companies voted "The 2001 Best Places to Work in PA."

The award program, created last year by the Ridge-Schweiker Administration and the Team Pennsylvania Foundation, is the first of its kind offered by a state, and is modeled after Fortune Magazine's "100 Best Places to Work."

"The 100 companies selected as the 'Best Places to Work in PA' are shining examples of the high-caliber employers that make Pennsylvania a leader among states and a competitor among nations," Secretary Butler said. "In the past six and a half years we have made operating a business in Pennsylvania easier than ever before. Those efforts are paying big dividends by improving the quality of jobs available in the Commonwealth."

Designed to recognize two types of businesses, the program ranks 50 medium-sized companies (50 to 250 employees) and 50 large-sized companies (251 employees or more). The companies making the list were chosen by the Great Places to Work Institute using the same formula that enables Fortune Magazine to create its national ranking of the best 100 employers in the country.

A scientific survey is sent to the employers and the employees, and the data is used to rank participants to determine the top companies. The employee evaluation carried 75 percent of the overall weight for the survey. Kuntz Leshner LLP, a Pennsylvania company, scored the employer survey.

"By being good employers, the companies we honor burnish Pennsylvania's reputation as a national leader," said Leroy "Tighe" King, the Team Pennsylvania Foundation's board co-chairman. "Our congratulations are extended to all those who make this state the best place to work."

To be eligible, participating companies must:

- Be a for-profit or not-for-profit business;
- Be a publicly or privately held business;
- Have a facility in Pennsylvania;
- Have at least 50 employees in Pennsylvania; and
- Be in good standing with Pennsylvania's Attorney General and the Department of Revenue.

"This program identifies and recognizes those Pennsylvania companies that have been forward-thinking and successful in creating the ideal working environments," said David A. Schankweiler, publisher, Central Penn Business Journal. "This program also gives Pennsylvania businesses benchmarks to further improve their place of employment and to compete with other states to attract quality employees."

The 2001 Best Places competition is a joint public/private partnership of its founding partners, including Team Pennsylvania Foundation; the Department of Community and Economic Development; Central Penn Business Journal; the Pennsylvania Chamber of Business and Industry; and Kuntz Leshner LLP. Team Pennsylvania Foundation, Marsh USA, HealthGuard, Binney & Smith, and Independence Blue Cross sponsored the evening awards ceremony.

Winners will be highlighted in a special newspaper supplement produced by the Central Penn Business Journal for statewide distribution in January 2002.

Team Pennsylvania Foundation is a private, non-profit organization funded with tax-deductible contributions from corporations, foundations and non-public interests. Its purpose is to foster economic growth and community development throughout the state. The Foundation is committed to making Pennsylvania a national leader in job growth.
